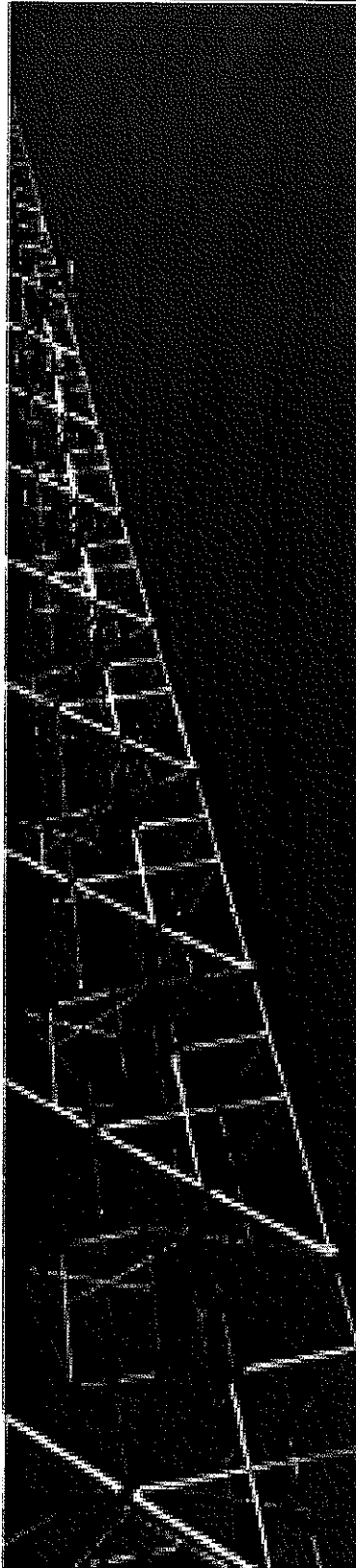

## **Regulatory Roundtable**

### **Panel Protocol**

- 1: Introduce Panelists (5 mins)
- 2: Present questions as outlined on the Panelist Questionnaire (30 mins to 2 hours)

Each Panelist should be allowed to respond or deny comment to the each individual question.

No time limit is set for the response time allowed each Panelist, however, they should not be allowed to "get off track" or onto subjects other than the question asked. (recommended time limit of 3 minutes max. per Panelist per question)

During this time period, Panelists should not be permitted to ask questions – an opportunity to ask questions will be provided at the end of that Panel's session.

- 3: Upon completion of the Panelist Questionnaire, the Panelists should be given the opportunity to bring up any issues or questions that they may have. (10-30 mins)

The Panelist Questionnaire can be cut short to allow time for Panelists to raise questions or issues on their own.

Each Panelist should be allowed to respond or deny comment to the questions brought up by the other Panelists.

- 4: Time permitting, questions can be requested from the audience. (5-20 mins)

Each Panelist should be allowed to respond or deny comment to the questions brought up by the audience.

Abusive questions should immediately be passed on and not responded to.

TCNS

- Used to notify Tribes of planned Tower construction
- Automatic notification and response system via World Wide Web

Issues with NPA

- Cumbersome forms
- Not all Tribes currently subscribe to TCNS
- Some Tribes notified regarding planned sites not in their area of interest
- Timeframe for complete approval has been extended as result of enacting NPA
- FCC may be backlogged with requests for Govt – to – Govt consultation

Goals of the Meeting

- Provide the various groups represented (both on the Panels and in the audience) a venue for open discussion of the NPA
- Provide a venue for face-to-face meetings with representatives involved in the various stages of the NPA process
- Develop a better understanding of issues/procedures the various groups have with the NPA
- Develop better cooperation between the groups represented (both on the Panels and in the audience)
